




POPULATION CHANGE 2020-2024






JOB GROWTH 2019-2023












KPB AVG. MONTHLY EMPLOYMENT




Average Sales Price of Single Family Homes, 2024


KPB TOURISM EMPLOYMENT


KPB TOURISM SPENDING

Taxable Sales in Key KPB Tourism Sectors








